Students access the program information and resources online through [CareerHub](#). Modules, activities and events on offer are listed in the WiSE Tracker.

As students engage with activities, they are awarded points for completion. The program has a 100 point target to achieve to be eligible for a Completion Certificate and Transcript at the annual end of year celebration evening.

The program is flexible and allows students to select activities of their interest. Our team monitors engagement and supports students where required.

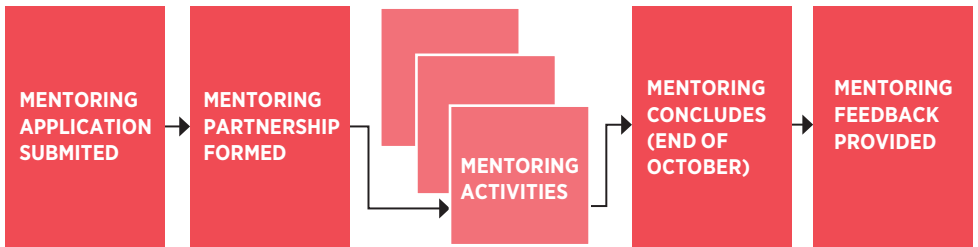

MENTORING STRAND



The Mentoring Strand of the WiSE Program is an opportunity for students to connect with industry professionals who can provide career advice, recruitment information, encouragement and support.

Students use their WiSE Tracker to express interest in being paired with a mentor. *Please note, priority will be given to students in their final year.*

Once students are paired, they will initiate contact with their mentor through the [Western Sydney Mentoring](#) platform provided by Gradway.

There are easy-to-follow guides to assist students in approaching their mentor and making the most of their partnership.

Mentoring partnerships can be formed at any time during the year. Students and industry partners are encouraged to apply as early as possible. The Mentoring Strand concludes at the end of October, prior to Stuvac and Exams.
