




SUMMER SCHOLARSHIP PROCESSES



- 1. Call for project proposals from Schools and Institutes
- 2. Student Applications through Jobs on Campus including meeting with the supervisors
- 3. Supervisors asked for input on preferred candidates
- 4. Allocation of student to project
- 5. Completion of three milestones along the way
- 6. Report & Presentation at completion of Scholarship





STUDENT ALLOCATION

Main aim of program is to provide as many opportunities for students as possible and to invest in undergraduate students, to encourage future research students


The allocation process considers the following;		
Preferences	Student preferences (3 project preferences) and Supervisor student preference.	
GPA	Students must have a reasonable GPA	
Course	Preference given to 2nd and 3rd year students who are continuing into further study	
Opportunity	Ensuring that there is a distribution of opportunities across schools and institutes.	





STUDENT APPLICATIONS

- Students can apply who have held a Summer Scholarship in previous years
- Students in their 2nd and 3rd years will be given preference; 1st year students will be required to provide a statement from a supervisor saying they are happy to have the student appointed
- Students completing undergraduate study in December 2021 will only be eligible if they have applied for further study (Hons, Masters etc) in 2022.
- As part of the process, students will be required to meet with potential supervisors. <u>Evidence of this meeting must be attached</u> to the application otherwise the applicant will be ineligible. Can meet by zoom, face to face, phone or if required, by email.
- Students are asked to provide three project preferences





What you need to consider

- These are FULL TIME scholarships. You will be required to complete 280 hours of work over what equates to about 10 weeks (taking into account the Christmas shutdown).
- There will be flexibility with being on campus, working hours etc.
 But the equivalent of 35 hours per week over the scholarship period will be required. If you are completing Summer Units, or working over Christmas, please consider the workload.
- Treat the meeting/phone call/email with your supervisor as an interview. You want them to put your name forward as the preferred student for their project.
- Choose three different projects with your preference choices. This
 makes a HUGE difference as to whether you are considered for a
 Scholarship at all.
- If you do take up the Scholarship and then choose to withdraw, and you have been paid, the University MAY elect to recover those funds. Of course, this depends on the circumstances around the withdrawal.





Student Timeline

- 13 Sep 2021 Applications opened
- 17 Oct 2021 Applications close
- If successful, you must be available for Orientation on Tuesday 30 November 2021 and a Presentation Day on Tuesday 15 February 2022. These events are likely to occur via zoom.
- The suggested working dates for the program are:
- 30 Nov 2021 21 Dec 2021 Orientation, project design and aims, and commence research
- 21 Dec 2021 3 Jan 2022 Holiday shut down (no work, University is closed)
- 4 Jan 2022 15 Feb 2022 Resume research project and Final Presentation/Report





Application Process

STEP 1: Review the research project descriptions and select three project preferences www.westernsydney.edu.au/jobsoncampus

Please note it is recommended that you choose more than one preference. If you choose only one preference, there is a greater possibility of not being allocated a project.

STEP 2: Download the 'Confirmation of Meeting with Supervisor Form' for each project preference.

Meeting with Supervisor

Meeting with the project supervisor/s is MANDATORY.

Make contact with the project supervisor/s, this should be done via email initially and you are strongly encouraged to speak with the supervisor/s via zoom or a phone call.

You must complete the 'Confirmation of Meeting with Supervisor Form' and upload to your application.

Failure to submit your meeting with supervisor form through the application process may result in not being selected to take part in the program.

When you meet with project supervisors

You will need to make contact with the project supervisors as part of the application process. This should be done via email initially and you are strongly encouraged to speak with the supervisor(s) via zoom or a phone call. The meeting should be an informal discussion and is not considered an interview.

Please complete this form to confirm that you have met with the supervisor(s) and discussed the requirements for each of your project preferences.

Please attach the signed form(s) to your online application.

Tips for the meeting

- Read the project description prior to meeting with the supervisor(s)
- Do some research on the project topic and on the supervisor(s) if possible
- Seek clarification of terms/concepts in the project description
- Prepare some questions to ask the supervisor(s) (e.g. what will be expected of me if I am successful in gaining this project?)
- Understand the research environment you will work in if successful (e.g. what challenges
 may be faced due to COVID-19 restrictions, where you will be based, what lab/office you
 will work in, what equipment/resources will be available for you).
- Be well presented and punctual to the meeting
- · Be ready to describe your skills and ability to complete the project

Application Form


After starting your application you can save it as a draft before submitting.


